58.1. Overview

Donors (corporate and individuals), the Australian public, sponsors and recipients of Cufa's development programs have a right to know how their funding/donations to Cufa are being spent to help people living in poverty according to Cufa's mission and values.

58.2. Cufa's commitment

- We are committed to being transparent and open about how Cufa raises and spends funds in both our International and Domestic Projects
- Within 30 days of Board approval we will publish on our website an easily accessible Annual Report that includes:
 - Requirements of ACFID Compliance Indicator 8.3.1
 - The full financial report
 - A plain English summary of our financial statements on how Cufa raises and spends funds in both our International and Domestic Projects and our overall financial health, as per ACFID guidelines and
 - Auditing requirements as detailed in ACFID Compliance Indicator 8.3.2.
- The annual report (with a plain English summary of our financial statements) is also available in printed form upon request.
- We will publish information on our projects and programs, evaluation reports, donors, feedback channels and Annual Reports on our website; and
- We will disclose fundraising and administration costs as per ACFID Compliance Indicator 8.3.3.

58.3. What information is available upon request?

The Chief Executive Officer will assess other requests for information and provide as appropriate, in adherence with Privacy and Confidentiality guidelines.
